Rök-runes / Ancient "t"

After Vémód stand these runes,
but Varin carved,
the father, after his dead son.

1

I tell the folktale,
which the 2 war-booties were
being taken as war-booty 12 times,
both together from man to man.

I tell this as the 2'nd,
who 9 generations ago
lost his life with the Hreidgoths,
and died there for his guilt.

Then Þjóðríkr ruled,
the bold chief of
seawarriors, over the
shores of the Hreiðsea.
Now he sits armed
on his Goth(ic horse),
his shield strapped,
the first of Marika.
